Public Consultation—Latitude 32

"Latitude 32" is an urban revitalisation project with a difference. The State Govt's land development branch, Landcorp, is seeking to redevelop parts of Wattleup and Munster for Industrial development in the style of Canning Vale, to be bounded by Russell Rd to the north and Rowley Road to the south. This development will include a major transport hub based on the rail services that bisect the Latitude 32 development as well as a range of light to medium industry. Road networks will be expanded to cope with the increase in traffic, some wetland areas will be protected, housing will be resumed and a thick development buffer will surround the estate restricting what owners can do with their land. But there's no question that thousands of jobs will be created. This is a project with some good features and some bad. Please take time to read and understand Landcorp's proposal and provide comments. Development may not start (and definitely won't finish) for years, but the decisions about land reservation are being made now. So NOW is the chance to have your say. *Your comments count!*

Police Dept meets with BRAG

WA's Asst Commissioner of Police met with a BRAG member recently following that member's difficulty reporting a series of arson attacks to authorities. Asst. Comm. Dawson spoke for nearly half-an-hour on the issues of crime in the community and, particularly, improvements being discussed at Police executive levels to the way in which 000 and CrimeStoppers services work together to track crime. He acknowledged that a system where the public had to report the same concerns repeatedly to the same or different authorities was a sign that emergency services weren't communicating effectively.

The good news for the community? Police services will be reinforcing the importance of customer service and follow-through so that community members who report crimes can stay abreast of outcomes and not feel like their contribution disappears into a sink-hole.

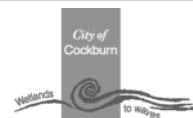

Sticking signs at the roundabout is prohibited.
