Applicants are required to contribute a minimum of 20% of the total cost of the project.</li> <li>• Conservation Works (precinct or groups) - Grants of \$1,000 or more are available for structural stability, streetscape and/or the elements of the precinct noted as significant in the State Register entry. Funding is available for privately owned places listed as precinct or groups on the State Register of Heritage Places. Applicants are required to contribute a minimum of 20% of the total cost of the project.</li> </ul>
