Where is Southwell?

Southwell lies within the suburb of Hamilton Hill located in the City of Cockburn.

The Boundaries of Southwell are defines as:

- Phoenix Road creates the southern boundary
- Blackwood Avenue creates the northern boundary
- Rockingham Road creates the western boundary and
- Stock Road creates the eastern boundary.

Southwell: A brief history

In 1919, the area we call Southwell was a grazing area for the cattle herds that had been introduced into the area by the early pioneers of Cockburn.

The land was endowed in the then Shire of Fremantle to be held in trust for the University of WA. This occurred about 1924.

In 1974, after discussions with all major stakeholders, the land was exchanged for a parcel of land in Murdoch that could be used for the University.

Southwell Estate was to be a new housing area for the State Housing Commission and soon the area that we call Southwell started to be developed.
